River Road Planning Study

Summary:

The River Road project is a proposed roadway that would run parallel to Mines Rd. (FM 1472) with the goal of providing a relief route to reduce congestion on FM 1472. The project is listed on the MPO's 2020-2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) "Project Needs List" and has been previously discussed and studied over the years. Most recently, in 2020, the Webb County-City of Laredo Regional Mobility Authority (RMA) recommended the project (identified as Aquero Blvd.) in the North Laredo-Webb County Transportation Planning Study.

On October 12, 2021 the MPO Technical Committee made a recommendation to the MPO Policy Committee to support and explore the possibility of developing the River Road project and/or other relief routes for FM 1472. It was also recommended that the MPO collaborate with the RMA on the project.

During the November 17, 2021 MPO Policy Committee, the RMA presented a proposal to undertake a study in participation with the MPO, with each party sharing 50% of the cost. The total cost of the study is \$250K. The planning study would consist of the following:

- Develop a final alignment of the roadway project and determine the traffic benefits for the surrounding area. The study will investigate 2 possible alignment routes and a No-Build option.
 - Alignment will be developed with stakeholder (Private Landowners, City of Laredo, Webb County, LPD, LFD, UISD, CBP, etc.) input via workshops and public meetings
 - Environmental Constraints Mapping and Analysis to identify areas of concern to avoid in the alignment (archaeological, biological, cultural, waters of the US, etc.).
 - Traffic Analysis to determine the benefits of the movement of traffic to the surrounding roadways such as FM 1472, Killam Industrial Blvd., River Bank Road, etc.

Purpose: Aquero Blvd. (River Road) Planning Study Background and Overview

- The North Laredo Webb County Planning Study that was jointly funded by the RMA and the Laredo MPO Coordinated Border Infrastructure Funds (FHWA) via an Advanced Funding Agreement with the TxDOT Laredo District was completed in March 2020. (*Note: This is the only study that has been jointly funded by the WCCL RMA and the Laredo MPO*).
 - A final presentation was provided to the Laredo MPO Policy Committee in February 2020.
 - The North Laredo Webb County Planning Study is the Master Plan for the North Area as the limits of the Study span from North of IH 69-W to SH 255 and is bounded by the Rio Grande to the West and IH 35 to the East. It provides the following:
 - > A list of projects to implement from 2021 to 2040 that will improve mobility in that entire region.
 - A schedule of when each project should be constructed over the 20-year time frame.
 - An order of magnitude construction cost estimate for each project (accounting for inflation for the forecasted construction time).
 - > A map depicting all of the master plan improvements.
- 2. Per the schedule in the North Laredo Webb County Planning Study, the planning phase for Aquero Blvd. (River Road) would commence in 2021/2022. (*Note that the Laredo MPO funded a 2006 Study that spanned from south of Bridges 1 and 2 to FM 1472*). The study for Aquero Blvd. (River Road) would consist of the following:
 - Develop a final alignment of the roadway project and determine the traffic benefits for the surrounding area. The study will investigate 2 possible alignment routes and a No-Build option.
 - Alignment will be developed with stakeholder (Private Landowners, City of Laredo, Webb County, LPD, LFD, UISD, CBP, etc.) input via workshops and public meetings
 - Environmental Constraints Mapping and Analysis to identify areas of concern to avoid in the alignment (archaeological, biological, cultural, waters of the US, etc.).
 - Traffic Analysis to determine the benefits of the movement of traffic to the surrounding roadways such as FM 1472, Killam Industrial Blvd., River Bank Road, etc.
 - Total duration of study would be 12 months.
 - Next steps after the study would be to develop a roadway schematic for environmental clearance, identification and acquisition of ROW and identify utility conflicts.
- 3. Cost and Funding of the Aquero Blvd. (River Road) Planning Study

- Study Cost is \$250K
 - Project Management \$25K
 - Environmental Constraints Mapping and Analysis \$15K
 - Public Involvement and Stakeholder Workshop \$70K
 - Traffic Analysis and Cost Estimating \$70K
 - Corridor Analyses and Report \$70K
- Study Funding
 - ➤ WCCL RMA \$125K
 - Laredo MPO \$125K
- 4. The Aquero (River Road) Corridor Study can be performed with a consultant that has been procured via a Professional Services Request for Qualifications (RFQ) pursuant and in compliance of the Texas Procurement Act.
 - WCCL RMA can advertise an RFQ for 30 days and negotiate a contract with a consultant specific for this Study.
 - Oversight of the consultant would be performed by the WCCL RMA General Engineering Consultant (HNTB Corporation)
 - Duration of time between WCCL RMA Board of Directors Approval of the RFQ advertisement, advertisement duration, consultant selection, contract negotiation and award would be about 90 days.
 - WCCL RMA can also utilize the GEC to perform the study. The GEC was procured in 2015 via an advertised RFQ process pursuant and in compliance of the Texas Procurement Act.
 - WCCL RMA GEC has performed a similar function in the past to develop the North Laredo Webb County Transportation Planning Study.
 - > The question of the GEC being able to perform the study which was funded with CBI (federal dollars) was discussed by the Laredo MPO in the March 2018 and April 2018 Policy Committee Meetings.
 - WCCL RMA Legal Counsel, Juan Cruz of J. Cruz and Associates provided a presentation to the Policy Committee in April 2018 describing the Texas Procurement Act and the RFQ process that the WCCL RMA followed to select and contract the HNTB Corporation as their GEC.
 - The Laredo MPO Policy Committee passed a motion in April 2018 authorizing the WCCL RMA and the MPO to enter into an agreement to conduct the North Laredo Webb County Transportation Planning Study with an 80/20 cost sharing between the Laredo MPO and the WCCL RMA. The vote passed unanimously with all present 6-0.
 - The Laredo MPO Policy Committee revised the motion in May 2018 to simply allocate the CBI funds for the North Laredo Webb County Transportation Planning Study, pending an execution of an Advanced Funding Agreement between TxDOT and the WCCL RMA with the cost being divided 80% via CBI funds and 20% via RMA funds. The vote passed unanimously with all present 7-0.
