RESOLUTION NO. MPO 2024-04

BY THE LAREDO AND WEBB COUNTY AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION POLICY COMMITTEE

SUPPORTING THE VISION ZERO PROGRAM AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE WEBB COUNTY-CITY OF LAREDO REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY SAFETY ACTION PLAN

WHEREAS, Vision Zero is a strategy designed to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all using the Safe Systems Approach; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero acknowledges that traffic crashes resulting in death or serious injury are largely preventable and that many factors contribute to safe mobility, including roadway design, human behaviors (such as speeding, driving under the influence and wearing seatbelts), technology, and policies; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero establishes clear strategies to achieve zero traffic fatalities and severe injuries; and

WHEREAS, One death on our streets is one too many; and

WHEREAS, Crashes involving pedestrians, bicyclists, or motorcyclists was more likely to be fatal or cause serious injury; and

WHEREAS, Equity is an integral component of Vision Zero with strategies such as prioritizing safety improvements in historically underserved areas and conducting robust engagement programs to reach the most vulnerable roadway users; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero aligns with the City's Viva Laredo Comprehensive Plan, Future Thoroughfare Plan, Laredo & Webb County Active Transportation Plan, Laredo Downtown Master Plan, Downtown Laredo Parking Study, Rio Grande Vega Trail Master Plan, Laredo Active Living Plan, Laredo International Bridge System Master Plan, LWCAMPO Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), LWCAMPO Unified Planning Work Program, LWCAMPO Transport Improvement Program (TIP), LWCAMPO Public Participation Plan, and the TxDOT Laredo District Strategic Highway Safety Plan 2023-2027 by emphasizing the needs of all roadway users and prioritizing improvements that address those needs; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Laredo and Webb County Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (LWCAMPO), that:

Section 1: LWCAMPO supports the Vision Zero Program and the Development of the Vision Zero

Webb County-City of Laredo Regional Mobility Safety Action Plan to protect the safety, health and security of its residents, businesses, employees, and visitors.

Section 2: Furthermore, LWCAMPO commits to a goal of eliminating all traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2040.

The Laredo and Webb County Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (LWCAMPO) is pleased to express its full support for the City of Laredo's Fire Department FY2023 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant application.

The grant will be supporting much needed federal funding for the hiring of thirty (30) new full-time career entry-level firefighters to activate the opening of a new fire station that will be located on mile marker 15 by Interstate Highway 35 in the warehouse district. The 30 new firefighters will be assigned to the newly proposed engine company and aerial truck which currently there is none in the warehouse district. The closest engine company is 7.3 miles away taking approximately 14 minutes; however, the response time could be much longer due to the congestion of heavy-truck traffic traveling to-and-from the warehouse district and on Interstate Highway 35.

As a result, the City of Laredo Fire Department and City Leaders including business owners and employees are in great need to have this new fire station inside the warehouse district as it is a safety concern to all. LWCAMPO fully supports the City of Laredo's SAFER grant application as we expect continuous growth in demographics and population in the warehouse district and nearby other Industrial Parks currently in construction.

Dear Mr. Mendive,

The City of Laredo Fire Department and our citizens, whom we are charged with protecting, respectfully request a letter of support from your office in support of our grant application for the 2023 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant offered by FEMA which we anticipate to submit in March of 2024.

The Laredo Fire Department (LFD) is seeking federal SAFER grant funding to hire thirty (30) new full-time career entry-level firefighters to activate the opening of a new fire station in the warehouse district located on mile marker 15 by IH-35. The 30 new FTEs would be assigned to the engine company and aerial truck that would be assigned to the warehouse district response area. More specifically, the new firefighters will aid in addressing the public safety response times due to continued population and demographic growth. In order to accomplish this, the City of Laredo anticipates hiring and retaining 30 entry-level firefighters who will be certified as Firefighter II/Paramedic and meet the certification requirement set by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ).

The SAFER Grant is designed to assist fire departments in enhancing their capabilities by addressing personnel needs. By obtaining this grant, the City of Laredo Fire Department could secure the necessary funds to hire and retain additional dedicated firefighters. Moreover, it will foster the development of a highly trained and professional fire service, potentially leading to new businesses, residents, and investments in the community, thus leading to much-needed sustained growth and development.



Congestion Management Process (CMP) Update

1.0 NETWORK DEVELOPMENT

A defined physical network that will monitor and measure for congestion mitigation and management was developed. This network is called the Congestion Management Process (CMP) network. Together, these roadways provide a basis for monitoring congestion data at a regional level for federal performance measures.

1 The CMP network was developed using the following data layers from Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT).Top 100 Congestion Roadways (TxDOT)

a Each year, the Transportation Planning and Programming Division of the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) contracts with Texas A&M Transportation Institute to identify and rank the most congested roadways in the state. The Laredo and Webb County Metropolitan Area Boundary has one segment on the list, Mines Rd / FM 1472, which ranks 25th for all traffic and second for truck traffic.

2 Strategic Highway Network (TxDOT)

a The Strategic Highway Network is a network of highways which are important to the United States' strategic defense policy and which provide defense access, continuity and emergency capabilities for defense purposes. These highways are major regional roadways and include US 83 and IH 35.



3 Texas Highway Freight Network (TxDOT)

a The foundation of the Texas Highway Freight Network is the Texas portion of the National Highway Freight Network. Additional highways critical to freight movement are also included and were identified through a systematic, data driven, and stakeholder-informed process during development of the Texas Freight Mobility Plan. Numerous roadways are included as part of this network.


4 Roadway Inventory (TxDOT)

a The TxDOT Roadway Inventory layer is a statewide dataset that has attribute information routed to TxDOT Roadway linework, including functional classification. Roadways with a functional classification of 1.) Interstate, 2.) Other Freeway or Expressway, 3.) Other Principal Arterial, 4.) Minor Arterial, or 5.) Major Collector were included in the CMP Network.


